About the University

Acharya Nagarjuna University, is quite significant in that the greatest Buddhist preceptor and philosopher Acharya Nagarjuna founded University on the banks of river Krishna some centuries ago. In 1967, Andhra University started a Post - graduate centre in Nallapadu, Guntur District, Andhra Pradesh, as an Extension Center to cater the needs of higher education of the people of this region. It is in the fitness of things that a university should grow from this Center to fulfill the desire of the people of this belt. Accordingly, Nagarjuna University came into being in August 1976.

Acharya Nagarjuna University since then has grown into a large University with Academic Departments having over 400 affiliated colleges offering Under-Graduate, Post-Graduate, Engineering, Education, Law, Pharmacy and Oriental Languages courses. Now it has 55 Post-Graduate teaching-cum research courses on the campus, while around 70 affiliated colleges offer PG. Courses.

About the Chair

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Chair was established in 1993, supported by Dr. Ambedkar Foundation, New Delhi, Govt. of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment Dr. B.R. Ambedkar who is hailed as the father of constitution, played an important role in the constitutional Development and emancipation of the deprived classes. The Center for Dr. Ambedkar Chair is focusing on Social Policy and Social action.

The objectives of the chair include to study, to propagate the philosophy of Dr. Ambedkar among the society, to encourage students PG Diploma in Ambedkar Philosophy, M.Phil and Ph.D Course had been offered. So far 25 Ph.Ds and 15 M.Phils had been awarded in Dr Ambedkar Chair, at present 30 scholars are pursuing Ph.D working on Dr. Ambedkar and Dalit literature, the Center is organizing seminars, symposia, lectures on Dr. Ambedkar's life, work and ideology and to provide a common platform to the scholars working on Dr. Ambedkar's thought in India and abroad to share their views and experiences. Dr. Ambedkar Chair had MoU with AMG India International and Helwan University, Cairo, Egypt.

Seminar Theme

The main focus of the proposed Two Day National Seminar on Exclusion of Marginalised - Need for Inclusive Policies: An Ambedkar Perspective is to tackle Socio-political and Economic inequalities of the

marginalized sections of India. The exclusion and inclusion existed on the lines of caste/ethnicity and religion, in the society. It also plays a key role in suggesting policy formulations aiming at eradicating the problem of social exclusion and discrimination and protecting the rights of these groups. Evidence in the social history suggests that the social exclusion on the basis of caste, race, religion, gender, etc., generates tension, violence and disruption within a given social structure. A form of alienation where in certain social groups are denied from accessing to the resources - perpetuating inequality and deprivation in society - the systemic exclusion experienced by the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and religious minorities in India is one example of social exclusion. It draws special attention and requires focusing upon at the present juncture. In this regard, The proposed Seminar can address the problem of social exclusion by studying, understanding and transcending the phenomena for policy evolutions on the issues concerning the social exclusion. The Centre for Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Chair, Acharya Nagarjuna University will bring together Scholars, Practitioners, faculty, bureaucrats diverse individuals, groups, and institutions to help in understanding the causes and consequences of social exclusion, and suggest remedies to fully include the excluded communities in the process of modernization and development of the country.

Objectives

- To examine the socio-economic political inequalities among the various groups in the society.
- To access the exclusion of Scheduled caste and Scheduled tribes into the main stream.
- To analyze the exclusion of women and its reflections on literacy, employment and occupational structure.
- To study the deprivation of access to resources among the marginalized groups.
- To understand the basic philosophy of Dr. B.R Ambedkar towards the inclusive policies.

Sub-Themes

Original research papers are expected from Research Scholars, Faculty and Scientists are invited for presentation. The following are priority sub-themes for intended seminar:

- Dr. Ambedkar Ideology for social transformation of vulnerable sections.
- Socio-economic inequalities of marginalized sections.

- Contributions of Ambedkar for Social Inclusion of Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Minorities.
- Policies and programmes for inclusion of excluded sections.
- Caste based Identities and Challenges for Inclusive Growth
- Dr. Ambedkar contributions for empowerment of Women.
- Dr. Ambedkar's Ideas on Social Justice.

Submission of Papers

Participants are requested to submit research based papers on the themes listed above. All papers must be original and should not have been copied / published or accepted in a journal or conference proceedings or presented at any conference. Abstract of the paper should not exceed 300 words and full papers not exceed 10 pages should be submitted in a hard and soft copies.
